Cazenove Road Traffic Safety Committee

Mara Bodis-Wollner (a parent of a child at Grasshoppers Nursery) together with James Simoniti of Hackney Safer Neighborhoods, is putting together a traffic safety committee to work towards improving safety for everyone during times of school drop off and pick up along Cazenove Road.

Ideally they would like to have two representatives from each of the schools along the road to come together, possibly only digitally at first, to look at the big picture (from a bird's eye perspective of Cazenove Road during drop off and pick up times), brainstorm about what the problems are (such as identifying bottlenecks and peak times) and what we can suggest to help ease them. They will then go to the council together with thoughts/suggestions and requests.

Parashat Tetzaveh

This week's parashat tells us some more denim (laws) of the mishkan (temporary dwelling in the desert). Moshe asked Bnai – Yisrael "If any one among you has olive trees, may I have it for lighting the menorah in the Mishkan?" Only the very first drops of oil that are pressed out of an olive may be used to light the menorah (as those first drops are the purest, and so they give the brightest light). The menorah was lit in the Mishkan and at later date in the temple in Jerusalem. Some say that the menorah was so bright and radiated such brilliant glow that the entire city of Jerusalem was lit up. Hashem nominated Aaron and his sons to be the kohanim (priests) and only they would have the privilege to perform G-d's avodah (work) in the Mishkan. Hashem also informed Moshe, "The kohanim have to wear special, beautiful garments more distinguished than the robes of any king during the avoda."

When the Israelites saw the kohanim in their extremely beautiful clothes, they realized that the kohanim were special people and they behaved respectfully toward them. The clothes would also remind the kohanim of their duty to serve Hashem.

The clothes of the kohanim were holy, and therefore many denim (laws) applied. For example; only the kohanim are permitted to wear the garments; the Kohen must only wear the clothes while working in the Mishkan; the Kohen must take his garments off when he no longer work in the holy Mishkan; the Kohen cannot sleep with these clothes out of respect.

Please take care of your uniform and wear it with pride. Show respect to others in uniform too.
