Last Sunday, 14th May we celebrated the festival of Lag B'Omer. This day marks the remembrance (some people feel it's the anniversary of the death of) Rabbi Shimon bar Yochai who was a leading sage (wise man) in the 2nd century and the greatest teacher of the Torah of his generation. It is also the day on which he revealed the deepest secrets of the kabbalah (teachings).

Many families celebrate the day by lighting bonfires (some say that Rabbi Shimon bar Yochai made a specific request that fires should be lit to symbolise the impact of his teachings or going on picnics and outings.
