Parashat Chuket

After forty years of journeying through the desert, the people of Israel arrived in the wilderness of Zin. Miriam died, and the waters that had miraculously flowed from the 'Well of Miriam' dried up. The people thirsted for water and complained bitterly to Moses about the lack of water. G-d told Moses and Aaron to speak to a rock and command it to give water, but when Moses became angry at the rebellious Israelites he instead struck the stone with his staff, disobeying G-d's wishes. Nevertheless, water flowed from the rock, but Moses was punished by G-d by being told that neither he nor Aaron would ever enter the Promised Land of Israel.

The journey continued and Aaron died at Mount Hor and was succeeded in the high priesthood by his son Elazar. After praying to G-d and thereby winning a victory in battle over the Amalekites, Moses' people complained about their food. After yet another eruption of discontent G-d sent venomous snakes to attack the Israelite camp for the people had yet again spoken against G-d and Moses. Praying to G-d to forgive his people, Moses was told to make a brass serpent upon a high pole, and all who gazed heavenward was healed of the poisonous bites.

Once again the Jews were attacked, this time by the Emorites who were waiting to ambush them in a valley between tall mountains, but miraculously the mountains moved towards each other, crushing their foe. Moses led the people in battles against the Emorite kings Sichon and Og (who sought to bar passage through their territory) and conquered their lands, which lie east of the Jordan.

Now the Jewish nation had finally reached the bank of the Jordan River, just across from the city of Jericho in the land of Israel.
