

## Presentation GUIDELINES

## **Presentation Guidelines – September 2014**

1. All written work to have a margin.

## 2. <u>All work to be dated.</u>

- 3. KS2 Maths long form unless already printed with LO and SC.
- 4. Title or Learning Objective written in the middle at the top, underlined once.
- 5. Learning Objective written before starting work unless pre-printed. Always printed for KS1, in Year 1 learning to stick in, by Yr 2, independent sticking.
- 6. Only write in pencil or blue ink when using pen. (ink types rather than biro). See handwriting policy for criteria to move to pen.
- 7. All maths work to be done in pencil.
- 8. Rubbers are not to be used routinely.
- 9. Any crossing out is completed with a single straight line.
- 10. No tippex, tippex pens or any kind of ink erasers.
- 11. When editing, spelling corrections to be written above the word and the original word crossed out. Children may use an insert sign or asterisk.
- 12. Any tables, diagrams, lines to label diagrams or graphs should be in pencil and ruled where necessary.
- 13. No writing on book covers other than name, class and subject.
- 14. No doodles or graffiti.
- 15. Use the most sensible next page or space without wasting space unless instructed by the teacher.
- 16. Worksheets or scaffolded activities should be trimmed and stuck neatly into books to show all work and progress made.
- 17. A4 books to be used from Year 1 upwards with book covers used for English, Maths and Science.
- **18.** Any work unacceptably presented may be redone in playtime or as homework **taking account of any special circumstances.**
- 19. Where a child is out of class for any reason (eg. Music lesson) this must be documented in their book, and an opportunity allowed for catch up.
