I would like to thank all those parents that attended the meetings last week, where I outlined the progress at Simon Marks Jewish Primary School, and as requested I will include a copy of the PowerPoint slides on the website next week.

It has been a pleasure to see all class teachers planning quality lessons, and it is clear that the children are enjoying their new topics and class trips, and I will include photographs of the visits on the school website. We have mapped out the activities that are happening this term, and the website will be updated regularly, ensuring that parents are informed of important information, which will also be included in our weekly newsnotes. I am really looking forward to the class assemblies that begin with Year 3 on Wednesday mornings at 9.10am – all parents are most welcome.

Thought for the Week – Parashat Shemot

While Joseph was alive and was the ruler of Egypt, the Bnai Yisraels (Israelites') life was pretty good as Joseph saw to it that no one bothered



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them. However, unfortunately when Yosef (Joseph) died, Pharaoh, the Egyptian king decided to be nasty to the Jews. He forgot that it was a Jew who once saved the whole country of Egypt from starving and made the country and its people prosper.

Pharaoh, together with his advisers, was worried that there would be more Jews than Egyptians and they devised a plot: They decided that all new-born Jewish boys would be thrown into the River Nile and they would also make all the Israelites slaves, who would work for them nonstop, day and night.

A baby was born and his mother was so worried about her baby's safety, "I cannot keep him at home any longer for fear of him being found. Perhaps, if I hide him in the River Nile, Pharaoh's people will think that he has been thrown into the river" she thought.
