Thought for the Week – Parashat Mishpatim

Once the Israelites were given the Ten Commandments, we learn in this Parasha, that Hashem teaches them 'Dinim' (laws) about how one human being should treat another.

The Torah teaches us that we must keep two kinds of Mitzvot (good deeds):

- 1) Mitzvot towards Hashem; for example worship Him, respect Him, honour Him and have faith in Him
- Mitzvot towards each other; for example should one take something from another person without permission? You should have respect for other people and their properties.

The Parasha teaches us laws that deal with damage done to people or their property and the compensation they should receive from any damage. It also tells us how to be considerate to peoples' feelings, how we should treat our servants and that they should not serve us for longer than six years. After this period we should

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set them free unless they wish to remain as servants.

Courtesy and politeness towards mankind is of utmost importance. We should never shame others in public. We also learn to be honest and to never lie.
