Parashat Acharei Mot-Kedoshim

The kohanim (priests) were not allowed to enter the kodesh hakdoshim, the holiest room in the Mishkan (Tabernacle) without permission. Sadly Aaron's sons did enter and for that they were punished.

The only person who was granted permission to enter was Moshe. Hashem told Moshe, "You, Moshe are different. You may enter the kodesh hakdoshim any time you wish because you are holy."

G-d was so pleased with Moses and the way he led the Israelites out of Egypt without arrogance and with utmost modesty that he made him holy. G-d told Moses to tell his brother Aaron when he could enter the Mishkan and what kind of garments he should wear and that he must keep himself clean before entering the kodesh hakdoshim.

The Kohen gadol (Aaron) changed his clothes on Yom Kippur five times. Each time he immersed himself in water. He poured water over his hands and feet twice, once before he took off his old set of clothes and once after he put on the new set.

Parashat Kedoshim has more mitzvot (good deeds) than any other parasha. Hashem spoke to Moses and said; "Gather and speak to the whole nation of Israel, man, women and children, and say: "You shall be holy, for I, the Lord your G-d, am holy. You shall be "קדוש" (holy).

The Torah teaches us to please and respect Hashem and our parents at all times. One of the mitzvot and in fact it is one of the Ten Commandments is כבד את אביך ואת אמך (honour your father and mother.) There are many ways of showing כבוד (respect); we may not call our parents by their first names, we must listen to our parents, we may not interrupt a parent who is speaking, we must always speak to our parents in a respectful way...

The parasha also teaches us how to treat other people and tells us ואהבת לרעיך (you shall love your neighbour as yourself). If only we were able to fulfilled the above mitzvot? We can try; as if we do the world will be a better place.
