How we have responded to recent acts of terrorism at Simon Marks

Following the recent terrorist attacks we have thought carefully about how we acknowledge and discuss these terrible events with children without creating an atmosphere of fear.

On Tuesday we joined in with the one minute silence held throughout the U.K., and our discussions with the children before and after this focused on the respect for all people, regardless of faith, that we find when we learn about world religions (and indeed, people who do not follow a specific religion). Through these studies we learn what unites the various religions rather than what divides us and we also learn that we have nothing to fear from people of different faiths.

We also discussed the core British Values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, mutual respect for and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs and for those without faith. Through this children can begin to understand how the majority create a safe, united country and how only a small minority try to disrupt this and try to create chaos.

When discussing the specific events we offer reassurance, clarify facts, encourage questions and encourage children to talk about how they felt

when they heard the news and how they feel now. By linking these discussions to what we learn about world religions and British Values, we can encourage community cohesion.

In one particular lesson observed we were very impressed by the calm, knowledgeable and reassuring teacher and by the thoughtful, open and respectful views of the children.
