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Thought for the Week - Parashat (Noach)

During the ten generations that followed Adam and Eve, the earth was filled with people, but sadly these people began to pray to the sun, the moon and other idols, Hashem (G-d) was angry, he could have punished them immediately, but he didn't. Hashem hoped that they would be sorry, repent and mend their ways. On the contrary, they were worse and they sinned even more.

Amongst these wicked people there was one righteous man: his name was Noach, only he and his family followed Hashem's commands. G-d said to Noach "I have not created this world to fill it with wicked people; I will wipe them out together with everything around them, but, you Noach and your family will be saved".

G-d instructed Noach to build a teiva (an arc), while Noach was building the arc he urged the wicked people to repent, telling them that Hashem was going to destroy the world with the mabul (flood) but to no avail. They mocked him and sinned even more.

The teiva was built on three floors; one to accommodate Noach and his family, one for the animals and the third for the food. Hashem commanded Noach to bring the non-kosher animals two by two, and seven pairs of each kosher animal. When they were all in the ark the mabul began, the whole earth was flooded and this lasted forty days. At first Noach sent a raven to find out if the flood was over; the raven did not come back which indicated to him that the flood was still on. He later sent a dove and when the dove returned with an olive twig in its beak that was a sign that the flood was over.

Noach asked Hashem not to send another mabul. Hashem premised that there will never be a mabul again to destroy the world, and as a sign of G-d's promise we now have the rainbow.

What we learn from this

Like Noach we must endeavour not to be influence by people who are badly behaved.
