This week we had our key stage two cricket celebration, after six weeks of training with the Middlesex County Cricket coaches we had a Key stage 2 play off. We used our hall and playground




On this occasion year four were the overall victorswell done year four!

Message from our Jewish Studies Department:

This week's Parsha is Vayechi, followed by Shemot. As we have now arrived at the end of the Autumn term, we have also reached the end of Sefer (the book of) Bereishit. This gives us the opportunity to look back, not only at the last term, but also the first book of the Torah. We remember the beginning and creation, and the children's start back in September. We welcomed in the New year, made resolutions and commitments for the year ahead. Children experienced sukkot at school, sitting in the Sukkah,

shaking the Arba Minim, with the accompanying prayers and songs. The term culminated in the celebration of Chanukah and the children's fantastic performances. These particularly showcased the amazing deeper knowledge and understanding that the children had learnt.

We have successfully launched the Aleph Champ Hebrew reading programme, to work alongside the reading of Ivrit. The School now has the amazing Jewish Interactive computer app 'JI Tap' which children can access at home, on a tablet or computer as well as at school.

As well as learning about the Parashat Hashavuah, the weekly Torah portion and practising their Hebrew reading, the children in Year 1 and 2 have been learning about a variety of Brachot (blessings), Year 3 and 4 have been learning and understanding the meaning and history of key prayers and Years 5 and 6 have been studying the journeys of the Patriarch Abraham and the Matriarch Sarah.

The children will be learning about the various Jewish festivals, including Tu B'Shevat, Purim and Pesach. They will continue their learning of the Parashat Hashavuah by focussing on the book of Shemot; the Egyptian exile and subsequent exodus, the splitting of the Red Sea, the giving of the Ten Commandments and the building of the Mishkan, the portable temple which the Children of Israel took with them during their 40 years in the wilderness. We will continue to emphasise the importance of Hebrew reading through Jewish Studies and Ivrit and continue to explore a range of Jewish values through the Parashat Hashavuah.

The values and morals in the book of Bereishit, such as kindness, truth, care and understanding have been taught across the school and reinforced during Shabbat and Havdalah assemblies. As a result, these values have embedded themselves across the school and helped Simon Marks shine out like a beacon.
