

## Curriculum Newsletter for Year 586 - Autumn 1 - 2019

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back! We hope that you all had an enjoyable break and are looking forward to the new school year. We would like to share our curriculum overview with you about all the great learning that we have coming up this term.

Please note:

- PE day will be **Wednesday** so please ensure you have your full PE kit in on these days including trainers. PE will be outside so make sure you have the appropriate kit to keep warm when it starts getting colder!
- Homework will be handed out on a **Thursday** to be returned on a **Tuesday**. Children will receive literacy and numeracy homework as well as spellings. They are also expected to be reading and practising their times tables on TT Rockstars.

In Jewish Studies we will be working on our Hebrew reading. learning about the upcoming Jewish festivals and visiting a synagogue to enhance our studies.

In PE, our focus is netball. We will learn and practise the required skills and rules before applying these to full games.

> In science, our topic is evolution and inheritance. We will learn about Charles Darwin's findings, adaptation, natural selection and what we can learn from fossils.

In Numeracy, we will be beginning by focusing on place value, negative numbers and the four operations. We will be building on our previous learning before applying these skills to reasoning and problem solving. We'll be working on our arithmetic and times tables skills daily.

## **Our topic:**

## **Industrial Revolution**

Our history focus is the Industrial Revolution. We will be learning about how life in Britain changed, what life was like for children and the impact and significance of the many inventions from this time period.

In Literacy, we will be beginning by working on a narrative unit based on a wordless book titled 'The Arrival'. We will be using this book as inspiration for our own narrative stories. Our first class book will be 'Brightstorm' by Vashti Hardy which we will be working on in reading sessions.

Our first computing focus will be programming using Scratch to make our own games.

In PSHCE, our focus will be rights and responsibilities and democracy. We will be thinking about our roles and responsibilities for the new year both in and out of school.
