Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the 2nd Autumn term. We would like to share our Curriculum overview with you and some key dates for this half term.

Our Topic for this half term is Savage Earth

In Jewish Studies, we are preparing to learn Chumash, working on our Chumash 'readiness' skills and then applying textual analysis skills to the narrative of Abraham travelling to Canaan. We continue to learn new tefillot and prepare for Chanukah. In Hebrew our topic will be "My Classroom" which includes colours, objects in the classroom and adjectives.

Our Science work will be on light and shadows. We will be looking at how shadows are formed and how they change shape and size.

We will also be looking at the different sources of light and how they are reflected from surfaces.

In ICT, we will be using our computing skills to create presentations and to also publish our work. We will also be using ICT tools to research.

In Numeracy our key skills focus will be on the four operations, geometry, fractions and decimals, number and place value and statistics.
