As we head towards the end of a very busy time in the Jewish calendar, we reflect on all the festivals that have been celebrated, both here at school and in many homes.

A few weeks ago, the children started learning about Rosh Hashana, the Jewish new year and reflected on the past Then we focused on

Yom Kippur, learning about the varied and rich laws and traditions associated with this important and Solemn day. As we headed towards Succot, five days later, the children learnt about the Succah, the Arba Minim, Shemini Atzeret and Simchat Torah, when we celebrate the completion and restarting of the Torah (the 5 Books of

Moses) which are read in the Synagogue every Shabbat morning.



Starting from next week, each Year group will be focusing on a different area of the Jewish Studies Curriculum. (Brachot, Tefillah, Chumash. Parasha)

Minim. We compared each one of the Minim (Species) to different



types of people, with different qualities, all coming together and working as one. We also explored the reasons for sitting and eating inside a Succah during this festival.



The children were very excited, as we had a visit



from the 'Tribe Van', a specially designed Succah

van. The van parked in the playground and all the children enjoyed waving Simchat Torah flags, singing songs and listening to interactive stories from the Tribe Madrichim (Leaders).
