

## Curriculum Newsletter for EYFS Autumn 2 2022

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the second half of the autumn term in EYFS. I would like to share our Curriculum overview with you.

<u>PE day</u> will continue to be on <u>Tuesdays</u>. Please ensure your child has their full PE kit with them: black shorts or jogging bottoms, white t-shirt and black indoor plimsoles. <u>Please label all PE kit</u>.

<u>Reading books</u> are sent home on <u>Thursdays</u> and pupils will be expected to return them to school on the following <u>Tuesday</u>.

Our Topic for this half term is 'Traditional Tales.'

Please take a look at our Curriculum Map for this half term.

In Literacy we will continue to use the sounds we are learning in Phonics to write words and simple captions. We will be reading traditional tales with a focus on: Goldilocks and the Three Bears, The Little Red Hen and The Three Billy Goats Gruff.

> We will be learning character names and words to talk about traditional tales. We will be leaning new words to retell these stories and act out scenes using stick puppets and props.

In Mathematics we will continue to sing number rhymes and songs and show the number on our fingers. We will continue to develop our counting skills and play addition and subtraction games. We will be learning to name and recognise some features of 2d shapes and use them to make pictures and repeating patterns. We will be learning to measure and compare objects by weight and length.

In PE we will continue to develop our ability to dress and undress independently. We will be learning to roll, balance and throw balls and beanbags and aim them with more accuracy. Our Topic this half term is

'Traditional Tales'

In Art, we will be using different mediums to create our work. We will be learning how to combine different materials to create collages of story characters. We will also be making our own stick puppets and props to support our retelling of stories. During circle time sessions we will continue to follow our class rights and responsibilities. We will be talking about our feelings and the feelings of characters from stories. We will be developing our sharing skills with the use of a sand timer for turn taking.

In Understanding the World we will be learning about the Hindu festival of Diwali and making Rangoli patterns and clay Diwa's. We will be baking challah for the little red hen and making porridge for Goldilocks and talking about the changes we observe in the ingredients.

In Jewish studies we will continue to learn about the weekly Torah Portion with Rabbi Goldmeir. We will also be learning about the festival of Chanukah and learning songs and dances for our Chanukah show. In ivrit we will continue to learn songs and basic words.
