

Curriculum Newsletter for Year 6 - Summer 1 - 2025

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to Summer I! We would like to share our curriculum overview with you about all the great learning that we have coming up this term.

Please note:

- PE day is **Monday** so please ensure your child has their full PE kit (including trainers) on this day. PE will be outside (weather permitting) so make sure they have the appropriate kit to keep warm if it is cold!
- Homework will be handed out on a **Thursday** to be returned on a **Tuesday**. Children will receive literacy and numeracy homework as well as spellings.
- They are also expected to be reading daily and practising their times tables on TT Rockstars.

In Literacy, we will work on narratives, recounts, poetry and instructions. We will also continue to work on a variety of spelling rules, grammar and punctuation. We will continue to read 'Rabbit Proof Fence' by Doris Pilkington in our daily reading sessions.

In Maths, in preparation for SATS, we will be revisiting topics we have covered this year. We will use these skills to solve mathematical problems. We will be looking at the 4 operations. Fractions, decimals and percentages.

In Jewish Studies, we will be continuing to practise our Hebrew reading and focusing on Yom Ha' Atzmaut. We will also be looking at the birth of Jacob and Esau.

In Art this term, we will be working on perspective. This unit of work build on from the unit on the Renaissance. The pupils consider how artists wanted to create realist pictures by using perspective.

In PE, we will be working on Athletics.

In Computing, we will be looking at the history of computing. We will be using Microsoft word, Excel and other Office programs.

Our History topic is the 7 ancient wonders of the world, in which we will learn facts about each historical landmark.

In Ivrit, pupils will be learning different descriptive vocabulary related to the body.

Our PSHCE/RSE unit this term will be about positive thinking. In RE, we will learn about beliefs and the benefits of religion. In Science, we will continue to learn about 'Living things and their habitats' we will be focusing on Vertebrates and how to identify them. In Music, pupils will be working on Renaissance and the musician Antonio Vivaldi's compositions.
