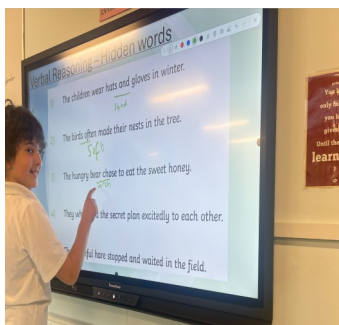

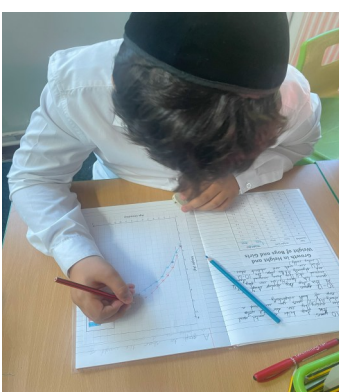
Parasha: Shabbat Chol Hamoed
